## low-budget activities to bring your team together

## Free

- take your team for a walk in nature think beaches, hikes or national parks. A special experience is the aboriginal heritage walk in the Melbourne botanical gardens (although self guided tours are widely available across the country).
- split into teams and **make short films** using only your phones, spend time scripting and storyboarding, producing, then present them to the group.
- volunteer with a local community group.
- take turns **presenting a 2 minute talk** on a different team members' special interest outside of work.

## \$50

- organise a fun evening at a nearby **trivia night** where teams of employees can compete together.
- pair up employees and challenge each pair to purchase an item from a local op shop for their partner that aligns with company values.
- ask employees to submit their top 10 favourite songs. Create
  a master playlist and have everyone vote for their favourite 10
  songs (excluding their own). Host a countdown event,
  awarding small prizes and humorous punishments to those who
  make the top charts and those who vote for their own songs.

## \$100+

- competitive charcuterie split into teams and create portraits of the boss from deli meat or fruit.
- split into teams and **spend time planning a 'bar'** for everyone to enjoy. Plan a theme, decorate, and design a drink, then spend a night visiting each teams 'bar' in your office.
- organise a scavenger hunt around your local area, providing employees with food and drink vouchers to try local specialties and connect with local businesses.
- pot luck provide a small budget and ask team members to bring a dish representing a specific theme, such as international cuisine or a favourite childhood meal. Share the stories behind each dish.
